"Nero d'Avola" is the most important red wine grape in Sicily and is one of Italy's most important indigenous varieties. It is named after Avola in the far south of Sicily. It is frequently compared with New World Shiraz wines due to its sweet tannins and plum or peppery flavours, and this corking red has all that and more. Topnotch full bodied and creamy-lush spicy red - powerful and yet utterly captivating.

Tasting Notes:

Intense and smooth red wine, full of ripe red berry (sweet cherrry, baked plum, damson and raspberry coulis) aromas and flavours supported by soft tannins.

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Specification	
Vinification	Harvest normally takes place between the second part of September and early October. The grapes are destemmed and gently pressed. With the addition of selected yeasts, fermentation takes place at controlled temperatures not exceeding 28°C. Frequent pumping over takes place in the early stages of fermentation in order to ensure optimum colour extraction and soft tannins. After fermentation, the wine is racked and the malolactic fermentation takes place in order to obtain perfect balance and harmony.
